Logging Service Hours

Don't forget to log your service hours for scouting for food. These hours go a long way to helping us earn gold as a district on our own Journey to Excellence. If you are a new or first-time user, you will need to register. REMEMBER you need to have your Unit ID and Unit number. The Unit ID is a unit specific number that is between 5 – 11 digits long. If you don't have this number, you can call the scout office at 704.333.5471 to get it. You will also need your four digit Unit number. This is your pack, troop or crew number written as four digits by adding zeros to the front (ex. Pack 162 = 0162 or Pack 46 = 0046). SCOUTBOOK -Lite

The current Internet Advancement platform will be retired and replaced by a new online tool called Scoutbook Lite. This new application is being developed from the original application called Scoutbook. Unit leaders can quickly key in advancement and other key data through a sleek user interface optimized for desktop, tablet, and mobile devices. **Scoutbook Lite will be a separate FREE application** and is for the units who do not already use Scoutbook. There is nothing in Scoutbook Lite that is not also in Scoutbook and they both write to the same database and will be able to see the data entered from either application. You can think of Scoutbook Lite as the 'no frills – data entry' version and Scoutbook as the 'full featured' unit management application; both writing to the same database. Scoutbook Lite will only display Rank, Merit Badges, and Award Dates. It is unsure at this time, if third party applications such as Troop Track or Troop Master will be able to sync with Scoutbook Lite or if the .CSV data file import option will be available. The Scoutbook database will become the official record of advancement for the Boy Scouts of America. Units that already use Scoutbook and are in sync, will not need to use Scoutbook Lite. Scoutbook Lite will also support Venturing advancement.



There are a number of simple steps to get setup in the Adapt-A-Highway program. The first and most obvious step is to pick a 2-mile section of roadway that you are interested in cleaning up at least 4 times per year. The next step is to call your local Mecklenburg County

NCDOT AAH Coordinator to see if the section of road or highway you are interested in is available as it may already have a sponsor. If available, you must fill out the Adopt-A-Highway Program Agreement and mail or fax it to your local NCDOT AAH Office for approval. Once approved, your section of roadway will be assigned to your Troop and will be good for a period of 4 years. After your initial 4-year term has expired, you will need to renew your agreement with NCDOT AAH.

Adopt-A-Highway Program Details:

- There is no fee associated with adopting a roadway.
- There is a four year agreement between the NCDOT and the Adopt-A-Highway volunteer(s).
- Adopted roadways have a minimum length of two miles.
- The agreement requires a roadside litter cleanup four times a year or more often if needed.
- Each participant in the Adopt-A-Highway group must view the safety video.
- Cleanups involve both sides of the road within the adopted two-mile section of roadway.
- A cleanup report is to be submitted after each cleanup.
- Filled bags of trash will be picked up by the NCDOT when requested through the cleanup report.
- Bags with items for recycling shall be taken to a local recycling center by the volunteer group.
- AAH groups can obtain safety vests, gloves, and bags at their NCDOT county maintenance office.
- AAH signs with a recognition panel will be installed, one at each end of the adopted roadway.
